Make Your PC Run Faster With a Registry Cleanup

Most people who use a PC will eventually begin to notice a gradual decrease in their computer's speed and overall response time. You might see this slowdown while you're browsing the Internet, launching a computer application or even while you're just trying to open a document. You might also start receiving some strange error messages during your PC's bootup routine, such as a notice that a file is missing. Your first instinct might be to blame this on a virus, and that could be the case. But many people don't realize that sometimes the only thing your computer needs in order to regain its optimal performance is a registry cleanup, sometimes called a reg clean.

A reg clean can be done manually or by using a registry cleanup tool. If you are even mildly familiar with the intricacies of the computer registry, you will agree that the registry includes so much detailed information that it makes manual registry cleanup a highly technical, time consuming and often impractical process. Luckily, many software tools are now available to help you perform a thorough reg clean. Every time you run these tools they look for old applications, dead links and suspicious referencing, which can signal a subtle malware attack. Computer crashes are often caused by junk files that were stored despite being required only once. Registry cleanup can find these junk files and guide you through the process of safely eliminating them without impacting your useful information. Performing a registry cleanup is often the best thing you can do to quickly nip any potential problems in the bud.

Despite all the good they can do, registry cleaners must be used extremely carefully. The registry is probably the most sensitive part of your PC's logical (software) component. Making even one small wrong move could cause your computer to immediately crash. Your files could be corrupted and computer applications might completely stop working. Although you would expect that the developers of registry cleanup tools are experts, you cannot depend solely on them because if anything goes wrong, you will be the one who suffers. Even worse, some registry tools (freeware is especially infamous for this) contain malware and use their label as a registry cleaner only to get access to your PC.

You can do three things to protect yourself from the potential dangers of a reg clean. To begin with, before you choose a software tool for registry cleanup, read the software's reviews. You'll need to watch for spoof review sites which can provide fake reviews. Instead, look for well established, authoritative and credible review websites and read the reviews there. Next, ask a techie friend for advice on which reg clean tool to use, or even better, hire a computer expert to advise you. Remember that the computer expert might be an interested party, especially if he or she will be the person from whom you'll buy the registry cleanup tool. Weigh that person's comments carefully and cross-check them with one or two other experts.

Lastly, do not be afraid to spend. With so much freeware available on the internet that promises to do just about anything under the sun, it is very tempting to just download and start using any registry cleanup application. Not all freeware is bad. However, cost should never be your main determinant for selecting the tool to use for the reg clean.
